The IELTS daytime programme is available to students at Intermediate (B1) level, B2 level and C1 level. It is designed to help students intending to take the IELTS test **Academic** Module.

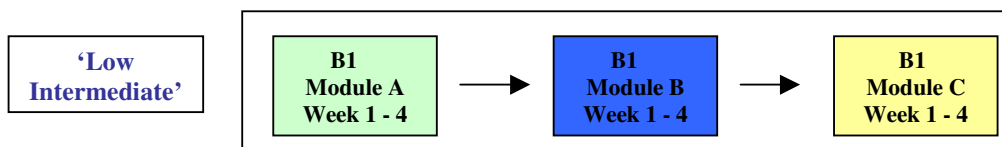
There are 2 successive programmes, at B1 and then at B2/C1 levels. Each programme consists of three 4 week modules. Each module reinforces and builds on work done in the other modules but using different materials.

The course focuses on test technique, skills work particular to IELTS test types (deduction of unknown vocabulary, rapid extraction of information from extensive reading texts etc.), structures of particular relevance to IELTS (e.g. passives, comparison, narrative tenses, linking etc.) and the study of formal language and texts with special reference to academic vocabulary.

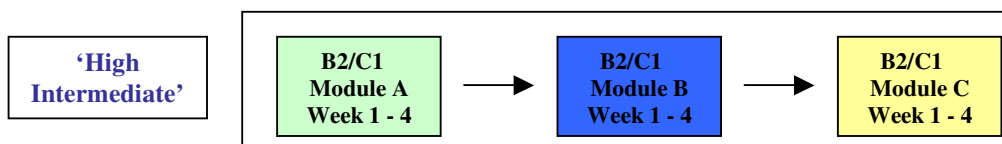
It would be possible for a student to do one 4 week module or anything up to 24 weeks on the programme.

Completion of the B1 module must be successful for there to be progression to module B2/C1.
